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PTA NEEDS YOUR SUPPORT....

The goal every year is to manage our budget in a way that allows us to continue supporting what our PTA Board and Membership consider to be important for our students attending the Secondary Campus. Each year, we budget for grants and scholarships, After Prom, senior class activities, teacher and student recognition, Community Service "Week of Giving," and more.

The biggest challenge for our budget committee this year was understanding the ramifications of the new Kroger Community Rewards program and how it affects the PTA and its fundraising capabilities. When the PTA received its first check from the new Kroger program, we learned two things:

- 1) The quarterly payout was going to be less than before – almost one/quarter of previous monthly payouts.
- 2) Kroger cannot provide a list of individual participants and their account balances due to privacy laws.

The result is a budget that will receive substantially less revenue and an inability to provide specific payouts to individual families. After a lengthy and thoughtful discussion, the Budget Committee decided it was only fair for the first check to be shared with FBOE to be used for band camp and the 8th Grade D.C. Trip since we believe this is from where the bulk of support came when the new program, Kroger Community Rewards, began May.

We are disappointed we cannot support individual families paying for band camp and trips at this time. However, we will continue supporting the Secondary Campus, and we hope every parent, teacher and community stakeholder will also continue supporting the school community by giving PTA the high five:

- 1) Become a PTA Member (Just \$5)
- 2) Buy a Phone Book. (Just \$5 and invaluable!)
- 3) Register your Kroger Plus card online www.kroger.com and designate Finneytown Secondary PTA as your recipient for the Kroger Community Reward program. Have your Kroger Plus Card Number or phone number available. **FINNEYTOWN SECONDARY PTA's organization code is 80481**
- 4) Support fundraisers like the Scrip Card (see page 3) throughout the year & Flower Sale in March.
- 5) Volunteer by baking or helping out in Community Service when called upon.

Thankfully, I am not alone in my belief and support for what PTA does for this school community. I hope you will join me and so many other families, administrators, and teachers by making this the very best year for our Class of 2013 and the rest of our students on campus.

STATE UPDATE

School-funding Hearings

The House Extended Subcommittee on Primary and Secondary Education hosted several hearings on school funding in July. The committee is using a website that includes the schedule for hearings, testimony presented and other useful information. The website: **studentlearningfirst.ohiohouse.gov**.

Sequestration in Ohio

The impact of federal budget cuts is expected to be about 8-10% overall for Ohio. According to a report by Senator Tom Harkin, Chairman, Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education, and Related Agencies, states and local communities would lose \$2.7 billion in Federal funding for just three critical education programs alone – Title I, special education State grants, and Head Start – that serve a combined 30.7 million children. Nationwide, these cuts would force 46,349 employees to either lose their jobs or rely on cash-strapped states and localities to pick up their salaries instead. In Ohio, 752 Head Start jobs would be lost, 3, 608 fewer children would be served, and \$22.4 million would be cut from the federal allocation. Ohio PTA will be keep updating you! How can we create environments of expectation?

1. We should make sure that we know what's expected of our children in school. This involves attending their Open Houses/Orientations and making sure that we read every single piece of paper that comes home from school so that we know what the school's expectation is for our children.
2. Check their daily planner and online progress report system, if available, so that we'll know what their assignments are and how they're doing in classes.
3. Help them with their homework when needed. As much of a challenge as this may be, especially with new math, offer our assistance for those subjects that might require a little extra help.
4. Encourage our children along the way. Let them know that they can accomplish what they put their minds to, they can solve the problem, that they CAN...!
5. Be their biggest cheerleader! There are so many factors and people that can discourage them. Cheer them on and encourage them along the way. (Validate their feelings, too!)
6. Make sure that we create a positive, supportive, and safe place for them to flourish,
7. Get help for our children when needed. Get tutoring, counseling, afterschool help – whatever is needed to help our children succeed.
8. Attend workshops, trainings, PTA programs, etc.
9. Allow failure as a learning experience. Allow our children to launch out on an activity even though they may fail. Not every child will make the sports team, student council, or debate team, but the efforts of trying out, preparing the speech for the election, or researching the issue are learning experiences.
10. Do research on their curriculum when forecasting time comes. Find out what classes are necessary to support their career aspirations.
11. Get to know our children's friends. Children are very much influenced by those who surround them. Make sure that they surround themselves with positive, studious, and goal-oriented friends, who will support and encourage them to succeed.

It is about creating excitement and involvement within our schools between parents, teachers and our students. As in years past, Elise Fessler will be coordinating the effort for Secondary PTA (Grades 7-12). Sandy Haskin will be the contact for the elementary schools grades K-6.

Deadline is Nov. 7th

Only new pieces of artwork inspired by the theme are acceptable

Arts Areas: Students may submit works in any of the six arts areas: Literature, Musical composition, Photography, Visual arts, Dance Choreography, or Film/Video Production. Finneytown limits students to FIVE (5) entries in each art area. Only two (2) entries per art area can be winners.

Originality: Each entry must be the original work of **one** student only. Because the program is designed to encourage and recognize each student's individual creativity, help from an adult or collaboration with other students is not allowed.

Use of copyrighted material is prohibited. This includes the use of copyrighted cartoon characters or other such material in visual arts or photography entries. Musical composition and literature entrants are not to borrow from copyrighted material either.

Children with Disabilities: National PTA believes it is the right of parents to place their child in the Reflections Program grade division that best reflects the child's developmental age.

Entry Form: All participants are required to fill out and sign the **OFFICIAL ENTRY FORM in its entirety.** Students who have not completely filled out the form will not be eligible for the program. In situations where a student is unable to fill out the form, the parent/guardian must complete the form.
